# Basque bibliography 2013

Joan Mari Torrealdai, sociologist, writer and President of the Jakin Foundation, publishes appraisal of the development of bibliographical publication in the Basque language during 2013. In this year, 1.822 books were published in the Basque language, 183 less than in 2012. Most of these publications are children's and young people's literature (33%), followed by school books (29%), literature for adults (14%) and books on human and social sciences (13,5%).
