Basque bibliography 2014

Joan Mari Torrealdai, sociologist, writer and President of the Jakin Foundation, publishes appraisal of the development of bibliographical publication in the Basque language during 2014. In this year, 2.110 books were published in the Basque language, 288 more than in 2013. Most of these publications are school books (33,5%), followed by children's and young people's literature (29%), books on human and social sciences (16%) and literature for adults (14%).
